The Year 9 boys were promoted into the main Essex competition this year, after winning the plate last season and we targeted reaching the quarter finals. The boys played some great rugby in their three group games and easily qualified for the quarter finals to set up a game against New Hall, which we managed to win on the last play of the game. Coopers Coborn was next up in the semi-finals and the boys played their best rugby all season winning 32-12. This set up an Essex final against last year's champions, Robert Clack, at finals day on Sunday 26th March. Unfortunately, this was one step too far for the boys and we eventually lost after a very tight game. The boys should be so proud of what they have achieved this year. Not only have we beaten four schools with excellent rugby reputations, but we are the first school **EVER** to be promoted from the plate completion and make an Essex main final. Well done boys and I look forward to next year's Essex and National campaign.





District Football

The district football season reached its climax, with all four teams reaching the semi-final stage of the competition after strong showings in the league.

First up was the Year 7s, who beat a previously unbeaten Bromfords 9 v 0 in a scintillating display of attacking football. Goals from Teddy K x 5, Tom H x 2, Jake B and Riley R secured their place in the final.

Jonny R took all the headlines with a hat-trick and a first goal of the season for Jaden C meant the Year 8s became the District Year 8 Football Champions for 2016/17. The seniors lost out by the odd goal in a really close final 1v 0 to Beauchamps, with a last minute goal line clearance denying the boys a well-deserved equalizer. The Year 7s suffered even more agony as they went down 3 v 2 in extra time in their Cup Final vs Beauchamps. The Woodlands goals came from Earl B and Teddy K, who will be looking to go one better next season.




Photography


