

Pupil Premium Vision Statement for Woodlands School

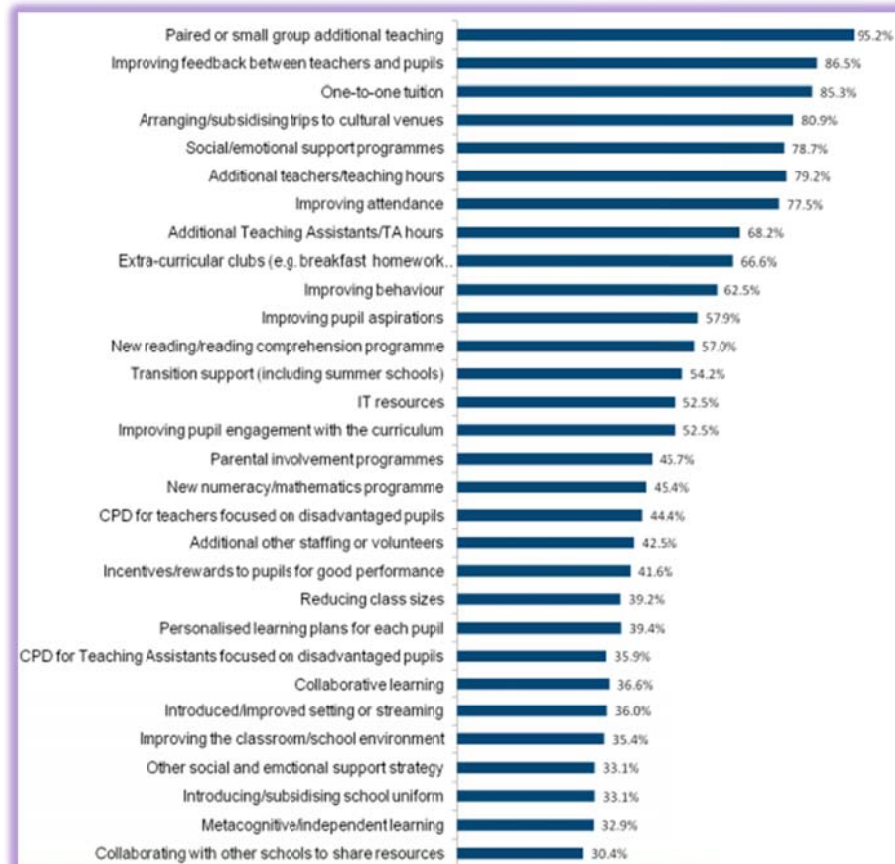
The pupil premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

In 2017 to 2018 Woodlands School received £935 for each child registered and eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. The school also received £1900 for each looked after pupil. Our Pupil Premium students currently make up 44% of our student population meaning that the projected funding is £599,335 for this academic year; nearly three times the average secondary school in the UK.

Our key aims at Woodlands school are:

- ✓ To raise **achievement** of pupil premium pupils
- ✓ To raise **aspirations** of PPG pupils
- ✓ To improve **attitudes** of PPG pupils
- ✓ To raise **awareness** and improve the **administration** of Pupil Premium
- ✓ To ensure school is fully **accessible** for all PPG pupils
